The Future of Privacy Forum (FPF) has received a two-year grant from the National Science Foundation to establish a Privacy Research and Data Responsibility Research Coordination Network (RCN).

The RCN will produce a community of academic researchers and industry practitioners to promote discussion of issues under the National Privacy Research Strategy (NPRS), supporting action toward technological innovation while protecting individual privacy.

At a time when industry actors are custodians of a wide range of consumer data, collaboration between industry and academia is critical to making practical privacy progress.
