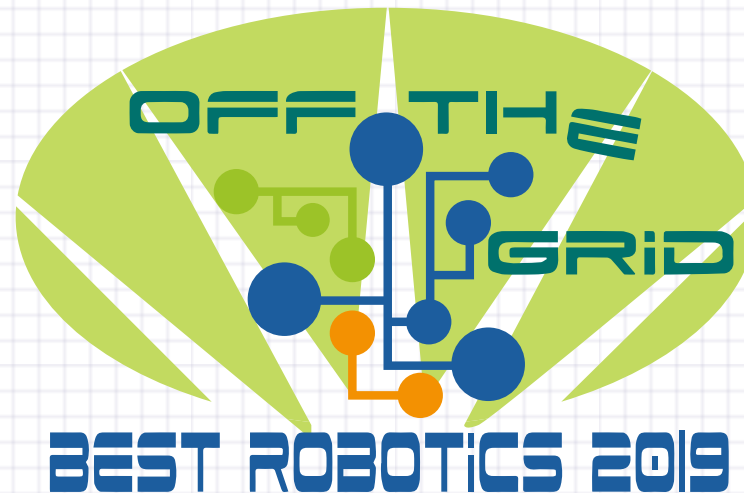

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Important Message for Students



- Music City BEST believes it is very important for students to acknowledge and appreciate the help and work provided by your teachers and mentors. Therefore, you will have the opportunity to nominate them for the BEST Teacher and BEST Mentor Awards.
- Music City BEST has decided to require each team to submit **AT LEAST ONE** nomination this year. It can be for either the BEST Teacher or BEST Mentor Award. We certainly encourage you to submit nominations for both awards, but we are requiring at least one.
- If a team does not submit at least one nomination, Music City BEST will deduct five (5) points from the Spirit and Sportsmanship component of the BEST Award.
- Your nominations will be submitted on musiccitybest.org.



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Student Run / Student Work



- The teams are to be student run and the robots are to be the students' work
- BEST expects that the students will
 - Fabricate & build EVERY PART on the robot
 - Write the entire notebook
 - Develop the entire marketing presentation
 - Build & construct the team exhibit
- If you do not know the answer to a judge's question, find a team member who does



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Noise Level on Game Day



- Yelling, clapping, coordinated cheers, commercially recognized musical instruments, and shaker type noise makers (commercially available or made by the team) are highly encouraged
- Air or electrically powered horns and noise makers, vuvuzelas, whistles, and simply loudly banging on objects will not be allowed during the competition
- Audio in the team exhibits must a reasonable level
- The judges are NOT giving points based on volume, they are judging based on the quality of the noise and how well it demonstrates team spirit

Wireless Devices



- No wireless devices will be allowed inside the playing field boundary
- Use of wireless devices outside the playing field boundary can interfere with the VEX controls
- **MOBILE HOT SPOTS WILL INTERFERE AND CAUSE ROBOTS TO DROP SIGNAL**
- **Make sure to TURN HOT SPOTS OFF on Game Day!!!**

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National BEST Registry



- **ALL** team members (students, teachers, mentors) must individually register in the BEST National Registry prior to competing on Game Day
<http://bestnationalregistry.eventbrite.com>
- Team members will need their hub name and assigned 4-digit team number in order to register
- At least one teacher from a team must register before the team members can see their school available under the hub
- Students should have parents/guardian do the registration (**NOT Teachers**) - can register multiple students at once
- Includes Liability and Photo consent steps for each individual
- Teams will receive points on their Engineering Notebook when proof of registrations is shown for their team members



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National BEST Registry



- Teachers will be asked to selection a Team Ticker Symbol
 - Unique identifier for teams
 - 6 digit alphanumeric mixed-case symbol
- Set/owned by Registered Team (guaranteed unique)
- Can keep or change each season (i.e. game themed)
- Does not replace Team Number
- Multiple uses (Leaderboard, # Social, Marketing, ...)
- Registry is mobile friendly

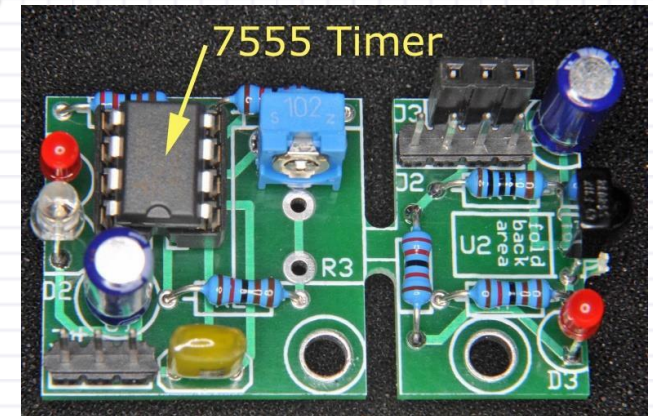

- Exhibit:
 - for students to display a visual story of the team's outcomes and impact
 - depicts the team's work in three realms: Robot/Product Features, Marketing/Branding, and Community Outreach/Advocacy
- Interview:
 - to strengthen students' communication skills - (as listeners and speakers)
 - validate their knowledge and understanding of the work done by the entire team
 - spotlight unique design features, activities, or learnings

Coaches Meeting National Registry (cont.)



- **Teacher Registration & School Profiles:**
 - A teacher **must register first** and complete the school profile BEFORE that school/team will become visible to other participants trying to register for the team
 - If team has no teacher but is sled by mentor (rare), mentor should register as Teacher
 - Teachers CANNOT register students (the system won't allow it)
 - If a Teacher has sons/daughters that are participating students it is advised to use an alternate email address (e.g. personal email)
- **NCES School ID (optional, but desired information):**
 - NCES ID is applicable for Public Schools only; a lookup link available
 - If team has combined MS/HS, use the High School NCES ID
- **Guardian/Student Registration:**
 - Parents registering their students as Guardian/Student are required to register at least one (1) student. They cannot create an account without at least 1 student (the system will not allow it).
 - If a Guardian/Student is registering and their Team#/SchoolName does not appear in the "Team#" pulldown menu, this means that the Teacher has not yet registered. They must wait for the Teacher to register for their school to show up in the list.
