

Fay Cook is on leave from Northwestern University at the National Science Foundation (NSF), where she has served as NSF Assistant Director and head of the Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences Directorate since September 2014 (see the related IPR and NSF articles). At the University, she is a faculty fellow of the Institute for Policy Research and professor of human development and social policy in the School of Education and Social Policy, with a courtesy appointment in the department of political science. Her research focuses on the interrelationships between public opinion and social policy, the politics of public policy, public deliberation, and the dynamics of public support for programs for older Americans, particularly Social Security.

• Joan Ferrini-Mundy is Assistant Director of the National Science Foundation (NSF) for Education and Human Resources, a position she has held since February 2011, and is responsible for the leadership of the NSF Directorate for Education and Human Resources (EHR). She had served the Foundation in a number of capacities since 2007 including as inaugural director of the EHR Directorate's Division of Research on Learning in Formal and Informal Settings. From 2007 through 2009, Ferrini-Mundy was a member of the National Science and Technology Council's (NSTC) Subcommittee on Education, and currently co-chairs the Strategic Plan workgroup of the National Science and Technology Council Committee on **STEM Education**.

Previously, was the Director of the NSF Division of Industrial Innovation and Partnerships. In 1998, he helped found Privaris, Inc., a biometrics security company and from 2002 to 2006 while on leave from the university Johnson served as its Chairman, President and CEO. Before joining the University of Virginia, he was a research engineer for Harris Corporation in the Government Aerospace Systems Division.
